



'Next year your wife Sarah will have a son'

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah.' 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. 

FERTILIZER FOR FAITH (3)

The **Shroud of Turin** is a centuries old linen cloth that bears the image of a crucified man. Is it really the cloth that wrapped Jesus of Nazareth, or is it simply a medieval forgery by a very clever artist? It has intrigued people over the centuries and is the most studied relic/icon in history. The shroud has verifiable history to the Middle Ages (1353) and a speculative provenance that dates crucifixion. There have been many scientific investigations including Radiocarbon and Wide-Angle X-ray Scattering to determine the shroud's age along with analysis of 3D photography, anatomy, pollens, dirt under the blood, the blood stains and the image on the threads of the shroud. Scientific investigation cannot currently determine how the image was formed and so there are many questions remaining. There is no evidence of pigmentation, paint or dye in the iconic image. Some argue that it is a sign for 'modern times' and ample proof of the Resurrection of Christ. There are many videos on **Youtube**, published books as well as scientific reports available online.
